Department of Psychological and Brain Sciences Ph.D. Minor in Psychology Requirements for Doctoral Students in Other Departments

Requirements:

- 1. A minimum of <u>four</u> (12 credits) Psychological and Brain Sciences (PSY) courses at the graduate-level (course must be listed in the *University Graduate School Bulletin*) is required. Our section of the *Bulletin* is available at http://www.indiana.edu/~bulletin/iu/gradschool/2012-2013/programs/bloomington/psychological-and-brain-sciences/index.shtml
- 2. The student must achieve a grade of at least B- in each course and an overall grade point average of at least 3.0.
- 3. The specific courses must be approved by a Psychological and Brain Sciences' faculty advisor and may include no more than one research course (PSY-P 895).

Instructions:

- 1. Visit the Psychological & Brain Sciences' faculty directory at http://psych.indiana.edu/facdirectory.php to find a faculty member whose research interests match your educational needs.
- 2. Contact the faculty member and determine if he or she will serve on your committee as your minor representative.
- 3. Follow your home department's procedures to declare the PhD minor. This may be as simple as updating your Advisory Committee.
- 4. Working with your minor representative, identify appropriate coursework.
- 5. Once you have completed the minor, Psychological & Brain Sciences can provide you, upon request, a memo confirming the completion of the minor. In most cases, your home department will contact as part of the process of preparing paperwork for your nomination to candidacy.
